Speaker: Professor Li Huailiang, Dean of the Institute for a Community with Shared

Future Communication University of China (CUC), Beijing, China

Paper Presentation: <u>Dr. Asif Saleem Head of Political Science Department Bacha</u> Khan University Charsadda

Topic: <u>Strategic Dimensions and Regional Security Threats to CPEC: Case Study of Afghanistan.</u>

In his Presentation Dr Asif Saleeem said that the geopolitical landscape of Asia, particularly regarding Afghanistan and the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), presents intricate challenges and opportunities. Afghanistan's stability is crucial for regional peace, with its instability having widespread repercussions across Asia. The CPEC, a significant project under China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), aims not only at

economic growth and trade but also serves strategic purposes by enhancing China's connectivity from the South China Sea to the Indian Ocean and Arabian Sea. However, regional stability is threatened by issues such as border disputes in South



Asia, internal political polarization in Central Asia, and extremism in the Middle East. Additionally, Chinese interests in Pakistan have been frequently targeted by terrorist groups, resulting in numerous attacks over the years. Afghanistan faces severe internal challenges, including political instability, extreme poverty, food insecurity, youth unemployment, and underdeveloped infrastructure. These issues are compounded by the presence of various terrorist organizations. Strategic interactions, such as the meeting between Chinese officials and Afghan delegates in 2021, highlight Afghanistan's role in the success of CPEC. The evolving political and strategic dynamics necessitate China's













active involvement in Afghanistan to ensure the continuation of CPEC and BRI. Dr Saleem concluded his presentation on the following key points,

Afghanistan's stability is essential for regional peace.

CPEC is a key project under China's BRI, enhancing strategic connectivity.

Regional threats include border disputes, political polarization, and extremism.

Terrorist attacks on Chinese interests in Pakistan highlight security challenges.

Afghanistan faces internal issues like political instability, poverty, and terrorism.

Presenter: Ms. Urwa Shahid MS Student from Department of History Lahore College for Women University.

Topic: Cultural exchange and Social Cohesion

In her presentation Miss Urwa Shahid highlighted that Cultural exchange involves the transfer of culture, values, beliefs, and traditions between societies, promoting understanding, tolerance, and appreciation of diversity. Milton J. Bennett defines it as an interactive process of sharing cultural traits, leading to increased empathy and unity. Social cohesion, described by Emile Durkheim, is the integration and solidarity within a society, based on shared values and norms. Both concepts are interlinked; cultural exchange strengthens social cohesion by fostering mutual understanding and respect among different cultural groups. Historical examples, such as the Christian Reformation and cultural exchanges in Islamic dynasties, illustrate how these processes have shaped societies and promoted social stability. In the modern era, technology plays a crucial role in facilitating cultural exchange and enhancing social cohesion by enabling instant communication and breaking down geographical barriers. Digital platforms and virtual communities allow for cross-cultural interactions that bridge divides, reduce stereotypes, and promote social harmony.













Key Points of her presentation are:

Cultural Exchange:

Defined by Emile Durkheim as the integration and solidarity within a society.

Promotes empathy and unity through shared cultural experiences.

Historical Examples:

The Christian Reformation and cultural exchanges in Islamic dynasties illustrate the impact of cultural exchange on social cohesion.

Influences include art, literature, religious teachings, and architecture.

Modern Era and Technology:

Technology enhances cultural exchange and social cohesion by enabling instant communication and virtual interactions.

Topic: <u>Cultural Exchange and Social Cohesion: Strengthening Ties through Mutual Understanding</u>

technology. Social cohesion refers to the solidarity and strong relationships among community members, aiming to promote well-being, fight exclusion, and provide opportunities for social mobility. The presentation highlights the significance of cultural exchange and social cohesion in international relations, particularly between Pakistan and China, showcasing various initiatives that enhance their bilateral ties. Educational exchanges, cultural festivals, tourism, and sister-city partnerships are some examples of how these concepts manifest in Pakistan-China relations. The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) plays a crucial role in economic integration, community development, and mutual support, contributing to social cohesion. Despite challenges like cultural sensitivity and language barriers, these efforts significantly strengthen the bilateral relationship and foster mutual understanding and cooperation.

Key Points of the presentation were:

Topics: Empowering Women in Tourism Development in Pakistan through China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)

In her presentation she highlighted that the development of tourism within the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) necessitates empowering women. However, women face significant barriers in this field, including gender-based violence and poor access to financial resources, which limit their growth and entrepreneurship. A transformative strategy, such as the establishment of "Women-Centric Economic Zones" (WCEZs), is needed to address these issues. The Global Gender Gap Index Report 2022 ranks Pakistan poorly in terms of women's economic participation, educational attainment, health, survival, and political empowerment. Studies indicate that a significant percentage of women feel unsafe due to harassment, have limited access to financial services, and face physical violence, all of which hinder their economic participation. Women's ownership of land in Pakistan is minimal, further limiting their access to collateral for loans. Women's empowerment is closely linked to several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including gender equality, poverty alleviation, health, education, economic growth, and strong institutions. WCEZs could enhance women's participation in tourism by providing













focused business opportunities, skills development, access to finance, infrastructure, marketing, and legal support. The potential areas for WCEZs along the CPEC route include Karakoram Highway, Skardu, Murree, Islamabad, Karachi, Quetta, and Gwadar. Empowering women in tourism faces challenges like gender-based discrimination, early marriages, limited access to education, unequal pay, safety concerns, traditional gender roles, lack of role models, and networking opportunities. Programs like the Aga Khan Rural Support Programme and Sindh's Women Development Department are already empowering women through vocational training and should be integrated into the CPEC framework. Women's empowerment in CPEC's tourism sector is vital for regional economic development, social progress, and cultural preservation, leading to a more inclusive and prosperous future.

The panelists agreed on the role of regional connectivity in enhancing social cohesion. Sonia Shams noted that connectivity initiatives could foster a sense of shared purpose and strengthen community bonds. Iqbal Sarwar added that community engagement programs and inclusive development projects are crucial in this regard.

Challenges and Mitigation Strategies:

Miss Wajeeha Khan moderated a discussion on the challenges posed by regional connectivity, such as potential cultural homogenization and psychological stress due to rapid socio-economic changes. The panelists proposed strategies including inclusive policies, mental health support, and education programs to address these challenges.
