
The Ideology of Legalism: Shang Yang, State Power & the Art of Ruling in Ancient China

Every human civilization has confronted the most perennial and existential questions of being and belonging since time immemorial – the questions of human nature and how to organize people in a social arrangement. Before there were Western philosophies on notions of human nature and state organization such as Thomas Hobbes's, "Leviathan," and Adam Smith's, "Wealth of Nations," Ancient China offered its own unique set of ideas and conceptions of these profoundly existential questions. During the Warring States period where rival Chinese statelets were challenging each other to rule all of the Chinese realm, the question of human nature was central to this historical experience as war was the normative reality of the people in the statelets.

Ravaged by the constant streams of brutalities of war, structural violence, and social inequalities, a distinct philosophy of power, rule, and law – legalism - emerged in this context of mayhem and disorder. The legalist tradition in Chinese politico-legal thought considered a view of human nature as wicked, impulsive, and self-interested individuals out to claw at every opportunity to their benefit at the cost of the welfare and protection of society and the state. This crucial insight into human nature was offered millennia before Niccolo Machiavelli's, "The Prince," and allowed one of the warring states – the Qin statelet – to eliminate the challenges from the other statelets and establish the Qin dynasty.






The Tao Te Ching: Examining the Concept of Taoist Philosophy



The Xia Dynasty: Myth or Reality? Exploring the Origins of Chinese Civilization

China is home to four of the oldest civilizations on Earth. The "Peking Man," who lived 600,000 years ago in the Zhoukoudian region near Beijing, is the earliest human remains ever discovered. In addition to being able to start a fire, the "Peking Man" could also walk straight and handle basic tools. The Xia dynasty, which is believed to have existed from approximately 2070 BCE to 1600 BCE, was the earliest of numerous ancient Chinese ruling houses. It is debatable, though, whether this dynasty and its civilization actually exist. According to many scholars, the Xia dynasty was a semi-mythical period of reign that was created by the Zhou dynasty later on as an excuse to topple the Shang dynasty, who was said to have overthrown the Xia dynasty. It is asserted that the Zhou Dynasty created the Dynasty in order to rationalise the fall of the Shang Dynasty and normalise the consequences of the previous dynasty's displacement. Since the Dynasty served as a transitional period between the early stages of a more modern Chinese society and the old Chinese primordial civilization, it was important to Chinese history. Chinese legend states that 17 emperors dominated the Xia Dynasty for nearly 400 years. Yangcheng served as the original capital before moving to Yangdi. Some of its people lived in the northern and southern regions of Shanxi province, while others lived in the western region of Henan province.


Philosophical Concept in Ancient China

Over the years, the concept of "li" (理), a foundational principle in Chinese philosophy, has been crucial in influencing intellectual and cultural debate. This is a complex idea that includes ideas like cosmic order, principles, reason, and patterns. We shall examine the nature of li, its historical origins, and its impact on different schools of thought in ancient China in this succinct analysis. During the Han Dynasty (c. 16th–11th century BCE) is when the term "li" first appeared and was used to refer to social rules and rituals. Confucius (孔子) and his disciples developed the idea of li during the Zhou Dynasty (c. 11th century–256 BCE) by combining moral principles and ethical actions. The Confucian school highlighted that li represented values such as justice (yi) and compassion (ren)

Fundamentally, li refers to the fundamental structure or pattern that is present in events and that can direct human behaviour. It provides a framework for comprehending reality and striking a balance in one's interpersonal and social relationships, acting as a link between the real world and the world of ideas. Confucian scholars often associated li with propriety (yili 禮理), suggesting that adherence to established customs and conventions would lead to harmonious relationships and wellordered societies. However, some thinkers, such as Mozi, argued that li must serve practical purposes and promote utility above tradition.
