VISIT TO PEOPLES'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

(From 7th - 11th December 2025)

On December 8, 2025, Mr. Jehanzaib Zahid, Vice Chairman of Habib Rafiq Engineering (Pvt.) Ltd., visited the Shenzhen University, Institute of Architectural Design and Research Limited (SUIADR) in Shenzhen, China. This institute is recognized as one of China's top architectural and urban design research centers.

During this visit, a collaboration agreement was signed between Mr. Zahid and Mr. Cao Zhuo, President and Chief Executive Officer of SUIADR. This agreement aims to enhance cooperation in advanced architectural design, research-led development, and smart city innovation.



Key aspects of the agreement include:

- SUIADR will share its internationally recognized expertise with Habib Rafiq Engineering (Pvt.) Ltd. , focusing on smart cities, urban planning, architectural concept design, and modern architectural standards.

B2B Cooperation Enhancement between China and Pakistan



From December 7 to 11, 2025, a business delegation from Pakistan visited Shenzhen and Guangzhou in China . This visit included B2B meetings with various organizations, such as the Shenzhen Mobile Communication Association, Beiming Software Technology Company, Gecko Automobiles, Shenzhen Intelligent Terminal Industry Association, and Leviathan Technologies, among others.

The primary aim of the visit was to understand the Chinese business culture and showcase the vibrant Pakistani market. Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram was part of this significant delegation, contributing to a deeper understanding of the Chinese business framework.

The delegation's engagement with the Shenzhen Mobile Communication Association provided valuable insights into China's advanced telecommunications and mobile technology ecosystem. Discussions



centered on 5G development, smart devices, and digital connectivity solutions, highlighting opportunities for collaboration in telecom infrastructure, mobile applications, and technology

localization in Pakistan. The association expressed interest in exploring joint ventures and knowledge exchange with Pakistani counterparts.

At Beiming Software Technology Company, the delegation explored China's expertise in software development, digital transformation, and enterprise IT solutions. The meeting focused on potential cooperation in software outsourcing, cloud services, and smart city solutions. Pakistan's growing IT sector and skilled human capital were presented as strong foundations for long-term collaboration in software engineering and technology services.

The visit to Gecko Automobiles offered a comprehensive overview of China's rapidly evolving automotive industry, particularly in the areas of electric vehicles and intelligent transportation systems. Discussions emphasized the potential for technology transfer, assembly partnerships, and market entry strategies in Pakistan.



At Shenzhen Intelligent Terminal Industry Association, discussions centered on smart terminals, IoT devices, and intelligent manufacturing. Pakistan's demand for smart technologies and manufacturing cooperation was emphasized.



The meeting with Leviathan Technologies focused on emerging technologies, including AI and advanced digital solutions, with interest in future innovation-based collaboration.

Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram participated as a speaker in the 4th Academic Symposium on “Global Security Governance” held at Chongqing, China

19 December 2025



On 19th December 2025, Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram Executive Director, Pakistan Research Center for a Community with Shared Future (PRCCSF) participated as a distinguished speaker at the 4th Academic Symposium on “Global Security Governance,” jointly organized by the Baize Institute of Strategic Studies at Southwest University of Political Science and Law, Chongqing, China, and the Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University, Bangkok, Thailand held at Chongqing, China. About 80 Scholars/ Experts from 27 countries participated in the event.

This year’s symposium was themed “The Contemporary Connotation and Global Significance of the Global Governance Initiative.” Keynote addresses were delivered by Prof. Ma Fang, Chairman and President at the Baize Institute for Strategic Studies,



Southwest University of Political Science and Law, and Professor Hu Ergui, Vice President of Southwest University of Political Science and Law, Chongqing, China. Both speakers highlighted the importance of strengthening international cooperation, advancing rule-based global governance, and addressing the challenges posed by an increasingly multipolar world.



Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram gave a keynote speech on “Rethinking Regional Security Governance in a Multipolar World” in the forum themed “Regional Practices in Global Security Governance”. In his speech, Mr. Akram analyzed emerging regional security architectures and highlighted the evolving roles of both state and non-state actors in addressing contemporary security challenges. He emphasized the importance of collaborative frameworks, multilateral cooperation, and knowledge sharing to strengthen regional stability in a multipolar global order. Drawing on practical case studies and policy insights, Mr. Akram proposed innovative approaches for

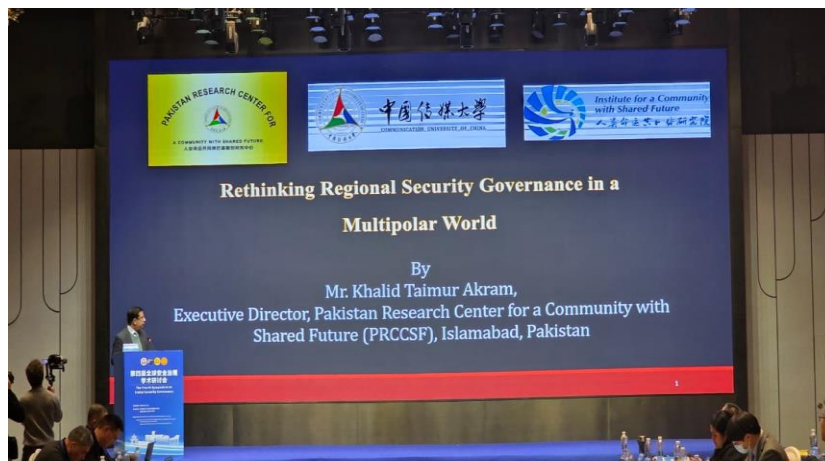


integrating regional practices with global governance mechanisms. His presentation was highly appreciated for combining scholarly analysis with actionable strategies for promoting peace, security, and cooperative governance. The symposium was structured into three thematic Forums, each focusing on a critical dimension of global governance and security:



- Forum 1: Promoting the Democratization and Rule of Law in International Relations

Discussions here explored strategies to enhance transparency, accountability, and the rule of law in international relations, emphasizing the importance of democratic norms and legal frameworks in addressing global challenges.



• Forum 2: Adhering to the Global Governance Concept of Extensive Consultation, Joint Contribution, and Shared Benefits

This session discussed approaches to cooperative global governance, highlighting how multilateral engagement, mutual consultation, and equitable sharing of benefits can strengthen international stability and development.

• Forum 3: Regional Practices in Global Security Governance

The 3rd forum focused on innovative regional approaches to security governance, evaluating case studies, best practices, and the role of regional institutions in promoting peace, stability, and collaborative security frameworks.

The 4th Academic Symposium brought together leading scholars, policymakers, and experts to discuss pressing issues in global security and governance successfully provided a dynamic platform for dialogue and exchange among scholars,



policymakers, and practitioners from around the world. By combining theoretical insights with practical perspectives, the symposium contributed significantly to the ongoing discourse on global security governance, emphasizing the relevance of regional practices and multipolar cooperation in addressing contemporary global challenges.

International Conference on “Bridging Horizons: Celebrating Pakistan-China Deep Rooted Friendship” Held at Bahria University, Islamabad

On 4th December, 2025, an international conference on “Bridging Horizons: Celebrating Pakistan-China Deep Rooted Friendship” jointly organized by the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Bahria University, Islamabad, in collaboration with the Institute for a Community with Shared Future (ICSF), Communication University of China (CUC), Beijing, and the Embassy of the People’s Republic of China to Pakistan, was held at Bahria University, Islamabad.

A month ago, three competitions, an article-writing competition, a poster competition, and a speech competition, were announced within Bahria University Islamabad Campus to engage students in exploring the depth of Pakistan–China relations. The response was overwhelming, with more than 150



students participating and showcasing their creativity, intellect, and perspectives. At the culmination of these competitions, a grand international conference was organized, bringing together students, faculty, scholars, and experts from various fields.

The conference featured four sessions, each designed to highlight various dimensions of Pakistan–China cooperation and to celebrate the outstanding contributions of the participating students.



The aim of the conference was to celebrate 75 years of Pak-China Iron Brotherhood and to engage Pakistani

youth in celebrating and reflecting on the enduring partnership between Pakistan and China, fostering a deeper understanding of its political, economic, cultural, and regional significance.

The welcome remarks were delivered by Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram, Executive Director of Pakistan Research Center for a Community with Shared Future (PRCCSF), Islamabad, who emphasized the purpose of the conference and its role in celebrating the enduring Pakistan–China partnership. He highlighted the importance of meaningful youth engagement in strengthening bilateral ties and fostering deeper mutual understanding.



The opening remarks were delivered by Prof. Dr. Adam Saud, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Bahria University, Islamabad, who welcomed the participants and commended their enthusiastic involvement. He underscored the significance of academic platforms in deepening understanding

Professor Li Huailiang, Dean of the Institute for a Community with Shared Future (ICSF), Communication University of China (CUC), Beijing, joined the conference online and, in his address, referred to the youth as true ambassadors of friendship between Pakistan and China. He emphasized the significance of this international conference as a platform for strengthening mutual understanding and collaboration. Prof. Li highlighted that the active involvement of young people is essential for carrying forward the legacy of Pak–China friendship into the future.



Dr. Hina Shahid, Head of Arts and Media Department, Foundation University, Islamabad, speaking on the theme “Media and Art as Bridges of Understanding between Pakistan and China”, discussed how media and art serve as powerful tools for enhancing cultural understanding between Pakistan and China. She emphasized their role in strengthening people-to-people connections and highlighted the importance of youth-driven creative expression in promoting bilateral friendship.



Ms. Wu Jiahao, Chinese Scholar, in her talk “From Iron Brothers to Strategic Partners: The Future of Pakistan–China Relations in a Multipolar World,” highlighted the evolution of the bilateral relationship and its growing strategic significance. She emphasized the role of collaboration in a multipolar global landscape and the potential for deeper economic, political, and cultural cooperation between the two nations.

Advocate Adil Aziz Qazi, Advocate Supreme Court of Pakistan and Former Vice Chairman of the Islamabad Bar Council, in his talk “Diplomacy in Action: Understanding the Pakistan–China Strategic Relationship,” highlighted the significance of diplomatic efforts in strengthening bilateral ties. He emphasized the strategic, political, and legal dimensions of the partnership and its impact on regional stability.



Barrister Zopash Khan, Co-Chair, The Society of Mediators, in his session “Integrating the Legal Framework for Connectivity through CPEC,” discussed the importance of legal structures in facilitating smooth implementation of CPEC projects. He emphasized how robust legal frameworks enhance cooperation, ensure transparency, and support sustainable regional connectivity between Pakistan and China.



Prof. Dr. Zafar Nawaz Jaspal, Meritorious Professor of International Relations and Dean Faculty of Social Sciences, Quaid-i-Azam University, Islamabad, the Guest of Honour, spoke on “Seven Decades of Friendship: The Evolution of Pakistan–China Diplomatic Relations.” He traced the historical roots of the Pak–China relationship, highlighting key milestones and the enduring trust that has shaped their diplomatic, economic, and strategic partnership over the decades.

Rear Admiral Naem Sarwar SI(M) (Retd), Director General of Bahria University Islamabad Campus, graced the session as the Chief Guest, highlighting the strategic importance of Pakistan–China relations and appreciating initiatives that engage youth in strengthening this longstanding partnership.

The exhibition provided a vibrant platform for students to visually express their understanding of Pakistan-China relations, attracting appreciation from faculty, guests, and fellow students alike. Learning Session on “Innovating Trade Justice: Advancing China-Africa Cooperation through AU & FOCAC Frameworks” for the Fellowship Program on the Concept of Community with Shared Future at the University of Sargodha

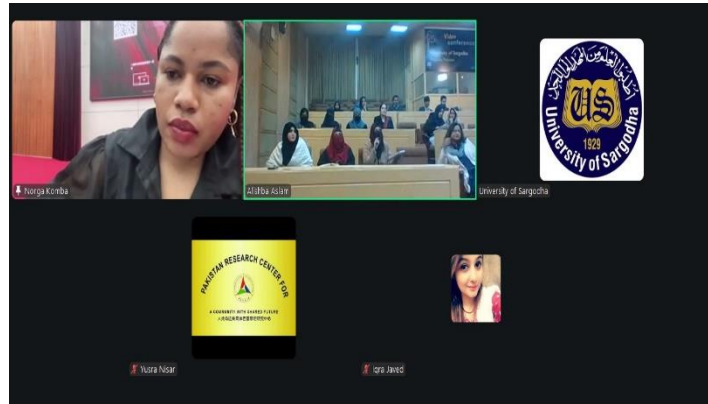


On 2nd December 2025, a learning session on “Innovative Dispute Settlement Tools in China-Africa Trade Cooperation: Building a Mechanism through the AU and FOCAC Framework” was conducted under the joint Fellowship Program on the Concept of Community with Shared Future at the University of Sargodha (UoS). The session was led by Dr. Ms. Norga Komba, Doctor of Law in Environmental and Natural Resource Protection Law from Wuhan University, Legal Scholar at the Research Institute of Environmental Law (RIEL), Founder of Ecosphere Solutions Limited (Tanzania), and Lecturer at Jordan University College, Tanzania. Dr. Komba provided a comprehensive overview of the rapidly growing China-Africa trade relationship and China’s BRI shape economic cooperation and create a pressing need for credible and modern dispute-settlement mechanisms.



During the presentation, she highlighted key challenges affecting China-Africa dispute resolution, including weak institutional structures, the decentralized nature of CAJAC, limited legal

precedent, and technology gaps. Dr. Komba emphasized the importance of harmonizing legal and policy frameworks between BRI and AfCFTA, modernizing Bilateral Investment Treaties, and adopting hybrid arbitration models integrating African legal norms with UNCITRAL rules. She also shed light on emerging dimensions such as the Digital Silk Road, digital innovation hubs, e-commerce expansion,



and the crucial role of sustainability in trade cooperation—linking these developments with the SDGs, Agenda 2063, green financing, and climate-smart infrastructure.

The session concluded with practical policy recommendations, urging the establishment of a Sino-African Trade Governance Council, a unified legal registry for trade governance, stronger digital equity initiatives, and enhanced environmental and social safeguards. A highly engaging question-and-answer segment allowed students to interact directly with the speaker, deepening their understanding of complex legal and economic themes.



The session was moderated by Ms. Yusra Binte Nisar, Research Assistant at PRCCSF, Islamabad, and Ms. Alishba Aslam, Research Officer at the Pakistan Institute of China Studies (PICS-UOS), who ensured a productive and intellectually enriching learning environment.

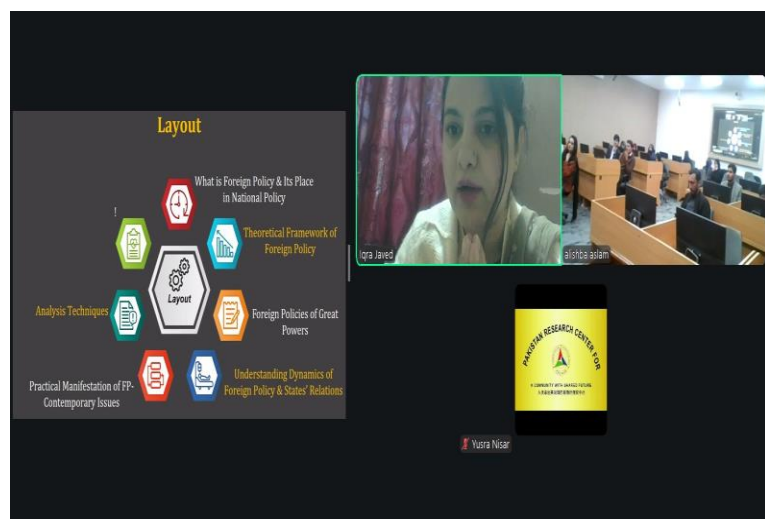
infrastructure connectivity, and economic integration through initiatives such as the BRI. Special attention was given to China–Central Asia relations, energy cooperation, and regional stability.

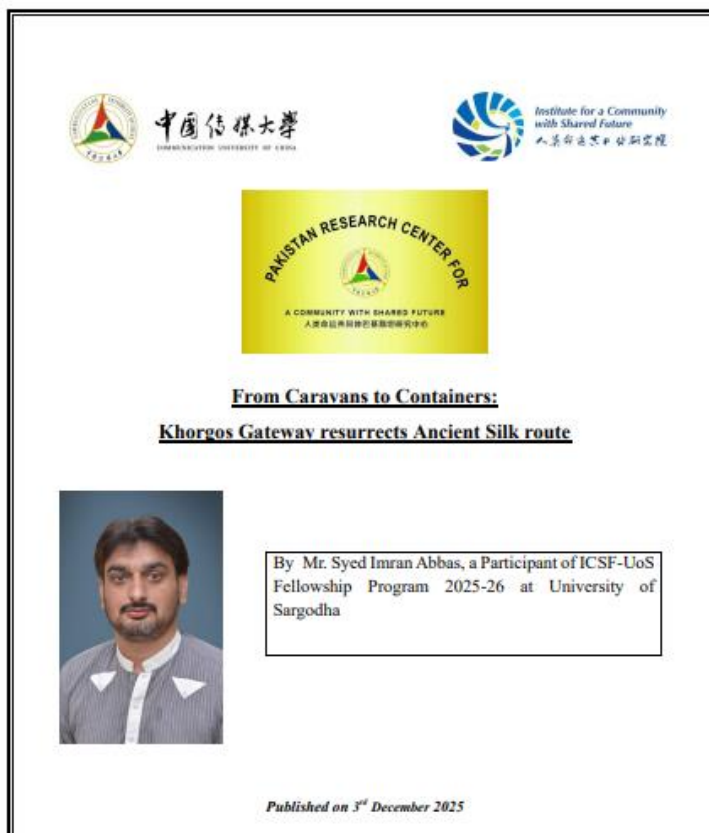

The explains that the Khorgos Gateway, located on the China–Kazakhstan border, is a modern revival of the ancient Silk Road and a key hub under China’s Belt and Road Initiative, transforming a remote border area into the world’s largest dry port and a critical rail-based logistics center linking China with Europe through Central Asia; by integrating different railway gauge systems and advanced infrastructure, it significantly reduces freight transit times compared to sea routes, supports the development of China’s western regions, enhances connectivity for landlocked Central Asian states, and strengthens Eurasian trade, although its long-term success depends on regional stability, security conditions, and broader geopolitical dynamics.



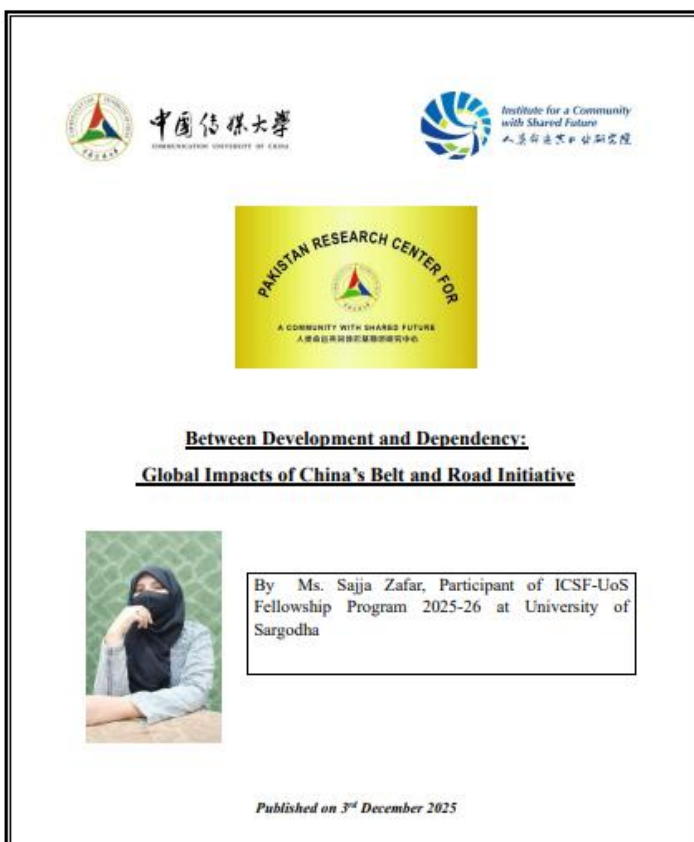

The article explains that China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), launched in 2013, has grown into one of the largest global infrastructure and investment programmes aimed at enhancing connectivity and cooperation across Asia, Africa, Europe, and Latin America by building extensive networks of roadways, railways, ports, energy pipelines, and digital links and by signing cooperation agreements with over 150 countries and international organisations, which has driven economic development in participant states by improving logistics, lowering trade costs, and boosting growth (for example increasing trade capacity and cutting transit times), but



has also raised debt sustainability concerns in some cases where heavy reliance on concessional loans has increased debt burdens; socially, it has created jobs and improved access to essential services like education, healthcare and broadband while also prompting urbanisation and displacement in some areas, and environmentally it has been criticised for contributing to deforestation and pollution.

These projects were efforts to deal with the long historical infrastructure deficit in Pakistan which has lessened the electricity crises and enhanced connections within provinces. Gwadar Port was regarded as a strategic point of Pakistan, which **gave China an easy way of getting into the Arabian Sea and reduced its reliance on the Malacca Strait to trade in energy**. CPEC was a lifeline to Pakistan since it provided jobs, growth and modernization. To China, it was a strategic route connecting western China to the world markets.
