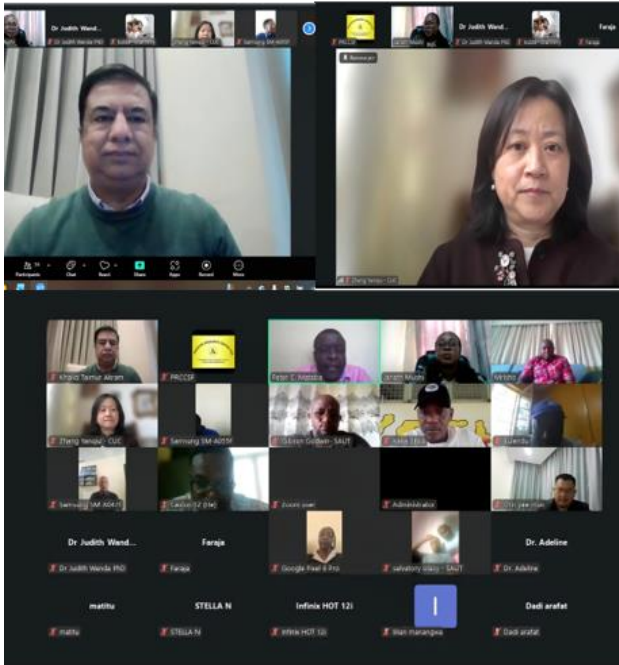

On 17 January 2026, Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram participated as a Keynote Speaker in the International Online Conference titled “Securing Cyberspace Sovereignty for a Peaceful, Inclusive, and Sustainable Global Community of a Shared Future”, organized by the East African Research Center for a Community with Shared Future, Tanzania. The conference brought together experts from various countries to discuss important issues surrounding cyberspace sovereignty.

SAUT, with Dr. Janeth Mushi serving as Conference Secretariat and Co-Moderator of the online sessions.

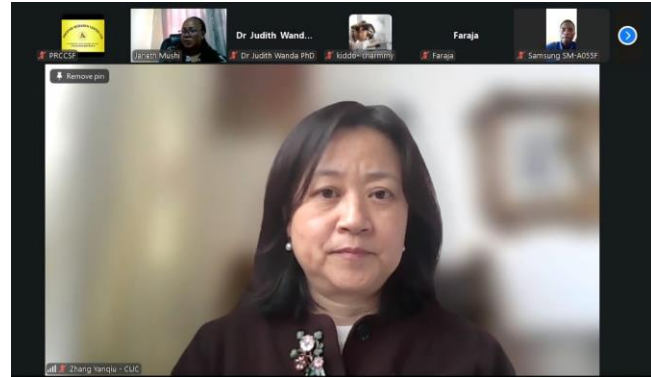

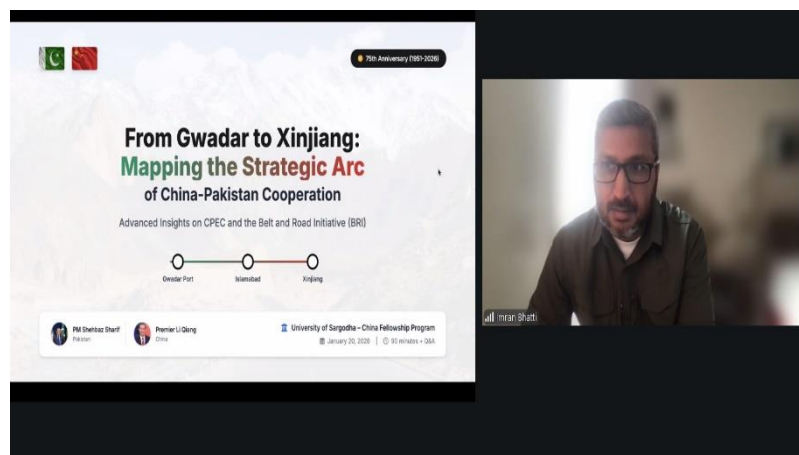
Learning Session on “From Gwadar to Xinjiang: The Strategic Lifeline of China–Pakistan Cooperation” for the China Fellowship Program at the University of Sargodha

20 January, 2026



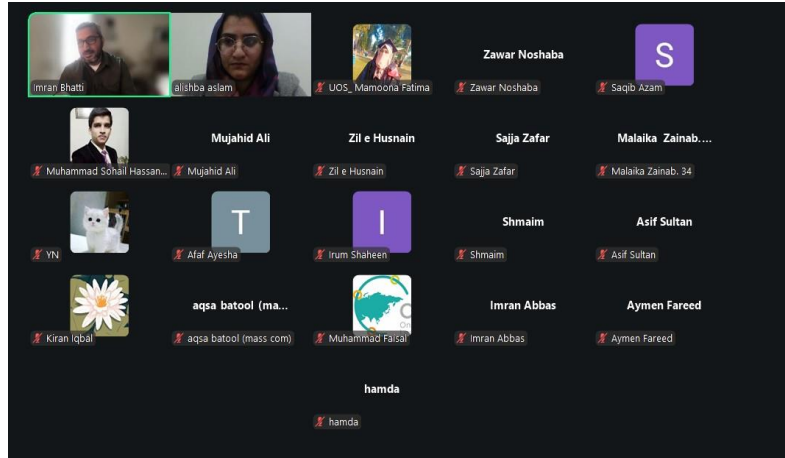
On 20th January 2026, a learning session titled “From Gwadar to Xinjiang: Mapping the Strategic Arc of China–Pakistan Cooperation” was conducted under the China Fellowship Program at the University of Sargodha (UoS). The session aimed to enhance students’ understanding of China–Pakistan strategic cooperation, with particular focus on the China–Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) within the evolving multipolar international system.

The session was led by Mr. Imran Bhatti, a Scholar in Strategic Affairs and Global Governance, Senior Researcher in Geopolitics, Security, and Cyber Strategy, and Member of the Board of Experts at the Pakistan Research Center for a Community with Shared



Future (PRCCSF). Mr. Bhatti provided a comprehensive and structured analysis of the strategic arc stretching from Gwadar Port to Xinjiang, highlighting its geographic, economic, geopolitical, and security dimensions.

During the session, Mr. Bhatti offered advanced insights into CPEC and the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), covering the historical foundations of China–Pakistan relations, key milestones from 1951 to CPEC 2.0, and the strategic importance of connectivity corridors linking South Asia, Central Asia, the Middle East, and Western China. Special emphasis was placed on CPEC Phase I achievements, including energy generation, transport infrastructure, and digital connectivity, as well as the priorities of CPEC 2.0, such as industrial cooperation, agriculture modernization, mining development, and green growth.



The session concluded with a comprehensive summary of key insights, underscoring the importance of understanding great power politics, regional connectivity, and economic diplomacy for students of international relations.

An engaging question-and-answer session followed, during which students actively interacted with the speaker. The discussion enabled students to clarify complex concepts, explore real-world policy implications, and deepen their understanding of contemporary international and regional dynamics.

The session was moderated by Ms. Alishba Aslam, Research Officer at the Pakistan Institute of China Studies (PICS–UoS), who ensured smooth proceedings and effectively facilitated interaction between the speaker and the students.

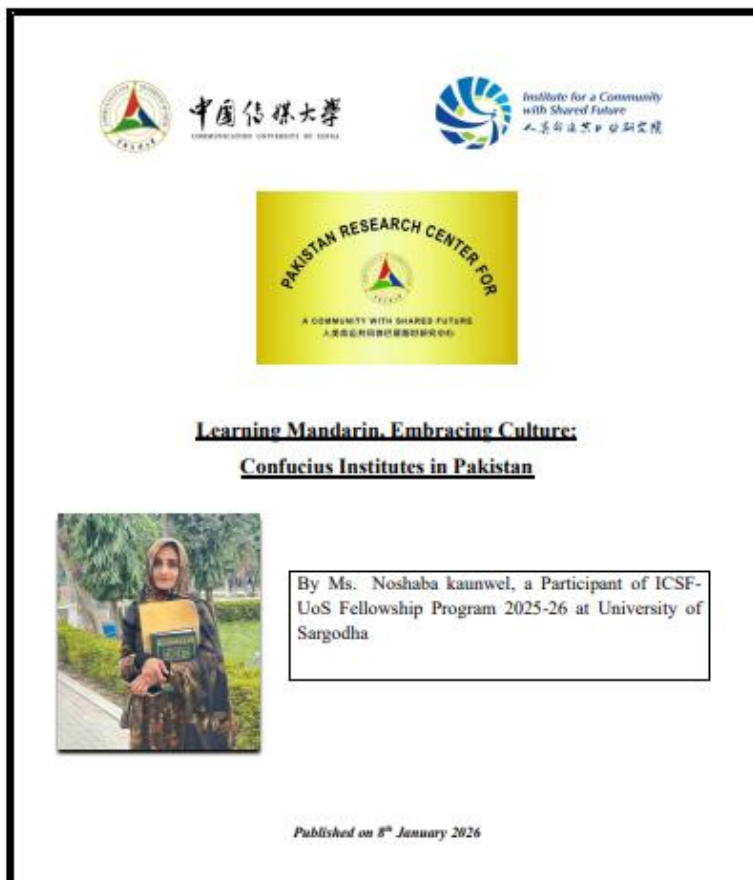

and suggests that meaningful global cooperation will require transparency, inclusive institutions, and collaboration rather than unilateral dominance in the digital sphere.

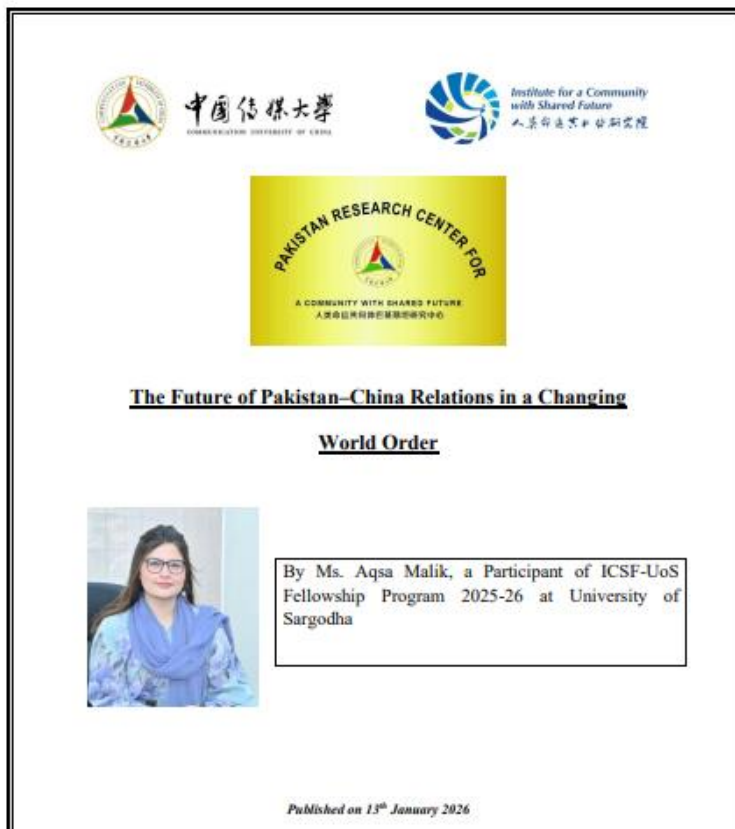

On 14 January 2026, Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram, Executive Director of the Pakistan Research Center for a Community with Shared Future (PRCCSF), joined FM 98 Dosti Channel's live program HUM QADAM in Islamabad to share his views on the changing global economic order. He explained that the real choice for the world today is not between China and the United States, but between protectionism and openness. This difference, he said, is becoming clearer with time and is essential for global stability and shared development. As a senior analyst on China affairs, he highlighted that China's record trade surplus in 2025 reflects long term planning, economic diversification, and the country's ability to adjust to shifting geopolitical conditions.

During the discussion, Mr. Akram noted that growing trade barriers and uncertainty in international markets have encouraged many regions, especially Europe, to strengthen economic ties with China. He emphasized that China's well organized supply chains, lower production costs, and ability to provide both raw materials and finished goods within one industrial system give it a strong advantage.

On On 22 January 2026, Mr. Khalid Taimur Akram, Executive Director of the Pakistan Research Center for a Community with Shared Future (PRCCSF), participated in FM 98 Dosti Channel's live program HUM QADAM in Islamabad, where he discussed global economic trends and evolving China–United States relations. He noted that since President Donald Trump assumed office, tariff measures and confrontational rhetoric have heightened tensions between the two economies. Mr. Akram highlighted that China's GDP reached approximately USD 20.13 trillion in 2025, reinforcing its role as a key global economic partner, particularly for Europe, whose deep trade interdependence with China makes economic disengagement unrealistic amid rising tariffs and geopolitical uncertainty.

Mr. Akram further emphasized that China has adopted a calm and strategic approach to global challenges while maintaining leadership in advanced technologies such as artificial intelligence, semiconductors, electric vehicles, and satellite communications. He stressed that China's complete supply chain advantage makes cooperation unavoidable even for US and European companies.
